Assignment: Watch the TED Talk: "What comes after tragedy? Forgiveness." Respond to the talk focusing of the following: What ideas/quotes stood out to you? One of the throughlines for Teaching for Transformation is "justice seeker." It says "I can see injustice and try to respond with love and fairness." It also references the verse Micah 6:8: "What does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God (NIV)." How are these ideas evident in this TED Talk?
