JOB DESCRIPTION

1. **Superintendent** – The Principal shall:

- Report directly to the Superintendent and cooperate with him/her and other administrators in every way possible.
- Administer the school site he/she is assigned to in conformity with the constitution of the school, Board policies, local, state and federal laws.
- Keep the Superintendent informed as to the condition and quality of the education program on his/her campus.
- Serve as a member of the Administrative Team.
- Perform other duties as determined by the Superintendent.

2. Students – The Principal Shall:

- Be involved in the admission process in a way determined by the Superintendent.
- Be responsible for the promotion and retention of students.
- Be responsible for organizing staff duties throughout the day.
- Be responsible for providing proper evaluation of students on his/her campus.
- Safeguard and maintain health and educational records of each high school student.
- Be responsible for proper instruction, discipline, attitudes, and behavior of students on the high school campus.

3. Staff – The Principal shall:

- Hold staff meetings and develop in-service education for instructional staff staff members at the high school level.
- Submit lists of personnel needs for regular, temporary, and substitute staff members and in conjunction with the Superintendent.
- Responsible for the screening and selection of candidates to be presented to the Superintendent for hiring of staff.
- Be responsible for the assignment of equitable work loads to the instructional and non-instructional staff members on the HS campus.
- Administer an active evaluation program of all personnel on the high school campus.
- Supervise all high school personnel assigned by the Superintendent.

4. Curriculum – The Principal Shall:

- Be responsible for the development of curriculum, and its adaptation to the needs, interests, and abilities of the students.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of all courses, instructional materials and physical facilities.
- Obtain approval from the Superintendent for the purchasing of supplies, textbooks, equipment, and all other materials.
- Act as a stimulant to teachers to get them to try innovative classroom methods and materials. He/she shall also work toward promoting the staff's professional growth.

5. Campus – The Principal shall:

Recommend campus needs to the Superintendent.

6. Organization – The Principal shall:

- Designate a staff member to act in his/her behalf if he/she is absent from the building.
- Be responsible for student and staff organizations on the campus.

7. Public Relations – The Principal Shall:

- Be responsible for keeping his/her staff informed as to board policies and administrative regulations.
- Inform constituency as to the events and activities taking place at his/her campus in conjunction with the office of the Superintendent.
- Be involved in Board-approved community service organizations.
