I can get to know them by asking them questions and hearing their answers.



### Storyline

### FLEX Story

Our students have been learning Spanish conversational phrases sharing the love of Christ; for example: "Dios te ama"; "Bendiciones"; "Cristo nació por ti", "Oro por ti." We then wrote Christmas letters and cards to Spanish-speaking kids and families at Grace Chapel. Most of these are new arrivals with few financial resources, so our students also participated in a division-wide toy drive for them. We prayed for them together. To complete the circle, our students asked conversational questions which Sra. Meeder will pose to some of the Spanish kids. She will video record them answering and greeting us.
