GOD WORSHIPPING

God Worshipping

Learners extend, both in daily tasks and in deliberate times of praise, their words, actions, talents, and thoughts in awe and celebration of God who is worthy.

Elementary Readings:

The books below offer examples of God Worshipping that emphasize how daily choices and small moments bring glory to God and show our love for him.

- **Ronnie Wilson's Gift**, Francis Chan. In this book, Ronnie Wilson demonstrates his love for Jesus by loving the people around him, exemplifying Matthew 25:40, "And the King will answer them, "Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me."
- **The Boy Who Gave His Lunch Away**, Dave Hill Jr. This book is a retelling of the miracle found in Matthew 14 when Jesus feeds the crowd with 5 loaves and two fish.
- **My Breakfast with Jesus**, Tina Cho. This book showcases people around the world, starting their day with Jesus.

Secondary Readings:

In addition to the readings below, consider drawing in a piece of music as a reading. Many hymns and praise songs sung in church are an excellent resource for a reading that inspires God Worshipping.

- **Oh For A Thousand Tongues to Sing**, Charles Wesley

Liturgy:

This **liturgy for God Worshipping** draws from rich passages of Scripture that call God's people to honor, praise, and delight in Him with their whole lives. Invite learners to lead different parts of the liturgy as an expression of worship itself—offering their voices, gifts, and presence to God. As they take ownership of various elements, learners practice seeing their participation not just as reading words aloud, but as actively joining in the worship of the God who is worthy.
